

The three gently rolling acres of Western Hills Nursery and Gardens have over a period of 40-some years been developed into a landscape incorporating many hundreds of varieties of perennials, ground covers, vines, shrubs, and trees, most highly unusual or difficult to procure and many seen nowhere else in cultivation. The garden delights through color, texture, fragrance, and the play of light and shadow throughout every season. From several foot-bridges that cross the streams, paths converge on a large pond of waterlilies. These water

features inspire visitors even during the winter rains.

Everyone appreciates the experience of being in a garden of such beauty, but those with knowledge realize the significance of this garden in its scope of seasonal interest, integration to site, incorporation of rare plants, and maturity where trees in particular have had decades to reach their potential. This garden, which enjoys local and international acclaim, is a rare botanical gem. We propagate and offer as many of the plants seen in the garden as we can.

Robert Stansel and Joseph Gatta are committed to preserving this horticultural treasure and continuing its legacy as a rare plant center. We will soon launch our mail order nursery, and hope to have a full availability list as well as an inventory of plants in the garden this summer.
